filed in this office its Articles of Incorporation as a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Alaska.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

FAIRBANKS NATIVE ASSOCIATION

THIS IS TO CERTIFY, that the undersigned, natural persons over the age of twenty-one (21) years or more and residents of the State of Alaska, do hereby associate themselves into a non-profit Corporation under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Alaska:

ARTICLE I

Name. The name of the Corporation is the Fairbanks Native Association.

ARTICLE II

Purpose. The object and purpose for which the said Corporation is formed shall be to assist and encourage the native in his advancement from his Native state to his place among the cultivated races of the world; to commemorate the fine qualities of the Native races of North America and to preserve their history, lore, art and virtues; to cultivate the morality, education, commerce and civil government of Alaska; to improve individual and municipal health and laboring conditions; and to create a true respect in Natives and in other persons with whom they deal for the letter and spirit of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution and laws of the United States of America.

ARTICLE III

Period of Duration. The duration of said Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

Place of business. The Corporation shall be located, and its principal business transacted, at the City of Fairbanks, Fourth Judicial District, State of Alaska.

ARTICLE V

Powers. The Corporation shall have the powers set forth in A.S. Sec. 10.20.140.

ARTICLE VI

Amount of Liability. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the Corporation may be subject shall be the sum of One hundred thousand (\$100,000.00) dollars.

ARTICLE VII

Membership. Those persons eligible for full membership in the Corporation shall be descendants of the aboriginal races of North America. Persons not such descendants, but married into such races, are eligible for full membership and all the rights and duties except that of holding an office.

(a) Native members -- must be 1/8 or more Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut, and shall be over the age of sixteen (16) years of age.

(b) Non-native members -- must be married into above-described races and are eligible for full membership and all the rights and duties with the exception of holding an office in the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

Corporate Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and a Sergeant-at-Arms, each of which shall be elected for a one (1) year term.

(a) Such officers shall be elected by the membership at the annual meeting held on the 1st day of April of each year.

ARTICLE IX

Board of Directors. The Board of Directors of the Corporation shall be five (5) in number, and the persons so to serve until

the first annual meeting are, as follows, to-wit:

ARTICLE X

Executive Committee. The Officers and the Board of Directors shall comprise the executive committee, which shall be directly responsible to the membership and any action taken by them must be approved by a 2/3 vote of the membership present at any meeting.

ARTICLE XI

Obligation. This Corporation is not organized for the pecuniary profit of its directors, officers or members, nor may it issue stock or declare or distribute dividends, and no part of its net income shall inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member, but any balance of the money or assets remaining after the full payment of corporate obligations of all or any kind shall be devoted solely to fulfill the non-profit purposes of the corporation.

ARTICLE XII

By-laws. The Corporation shall adopt by-laws for the conduct of its affairs consistent with these articles of incorporation and the laws of the State of Alaska pertaining to non-profit corporations, and the laws and the Constitution of the United States.

ARTICLE XIII

Amendments. These Articles of Incorporation may be amended

at a regular or special meeting of the members of the Corporation, called for that purpose, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present or represented at the meeting. However, no amendment of the Articles of Incorporation shall be made at a regular or special meeting unless a notice is mailed to each member at his last address of record at least thirty (30) days before the meeting, stating that it is proposed that the Articles be amended at the meeting.
