Fairbanks, Alaska – Steve Ginnis, Fairbanks Native Association executive director extended a work-from-home plan for staff to June 26.

Staff will be available by phone or email, and will be reaching out to program participants.

This excludes essential staff at FNA Behavioral Health Services, who will be returning to the workplace starting June 22.

“These employees will complete the necessary medical clearances to return to the work place in a safe and calculated manner,” said Steve Ginnis, FNA executive director. “We have an obligation to protect our employees and consumers.”
