Following graduation, he served in the U.S. Army before attending the University of Alaska, Fairbanks. Steve served as President of Tanana Chiefs Conference, (TCC) from 1999-2002. Prior to TCC Steve served in many service-oriented capacities, including Chief and City Manager for Fort Yukon; Chairman for Alaska Inter-Tribal Council (AITC); TCC Board member; Doyon limited; Council for Athabascan Tribal Governments (CATG); Yukon Flats School District; and area Vice President to the National Congress of American Indians (NCAI).




Friday, December 19, 2008 3-6 p.m. Open House Gateway to Recovery

The building has just been completed for our new detoxification center. It will be located on South Cushman adjacent to the new Fairbanks Community Mental Health Center, and will provide a behavioral health campus atmosphere. Enhanced services will integrate mental health and substance abuse treatment to better meet the patient's needs.

A unique partnership has been formed with the State of Alaska, local non-profits and private stakeholders to better serve the Fairbanks community. The doors will officially be opened January 2009.

carnival in which there were 268 youth and parents participating in various activities. In November we held another youth dance (Ch'eghutsen' Bash) in which 30 youth participated.




COMMUNITY SERVICES/ELDERS Thanksgiving Lunch




EARLY HEAD START WINTER CARNIVAL
