2024 CONTESTANT CODE OF CONDUCT AND GENERAL GUIDELINES

CATEGORIES JUDGED:

The Miss FNA contestants hold numerous public appearances and have many opportunities to present themselves and share their culture with others. Judges will be present to rate the following categories:

- Originality;
- Confidence;
- Poise;
- Personality;

ACTIVITIES JUDGED:

- Personal interviews;
- Talent presentation ~ 5 minutes;
- Impromptu question;
- Most photogenic will be selected by the press, if there are at least 3 contestants; and
- Miss Congeniality may be selected by fellow contestants.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA, RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS:

All Miss FNA contestants must:

- Be female, single, never married, not expecting a child nor given birth to a child;
- 18-24 years of age
- A direct descendant of an individual who is Athabascan, Inupiaq, Yup'ik, Unangan, Tlingit, Haida, Tsimshian, Cup'ik, Sugpiaq, Eyak and/or Alaska Native/American Indian
- Fairbanks resident (30 days)
- Show respect to FNA and the other queen contestants by being on time for scheduled activities;
- Remember that you represent the community and your families;
- Be mindful of your manners;
- Accept the decision of the judges' panel graciously;
- Be alcohol and drug free with this event and, if selected Miss FNA, remain so throughout the year of reign; and
- Not smoke in public while a contestant and/or reigning Miss FNA.

DUTIES OF MISS FNA:

The young lady who earns the privilege of wearing the Miss FNA crown is expected to carry on with pride and to respect the overall mission of FNA.

- Participate in Fairbanks Native Association functions as requested;
- Participate in the annual Alaska Native Education Awards presentation;
- Participate in the regular Fairbanks Native Association's board meetings;
- Represent the Fairbanks Native Association in the World Eskimo-Indian Olympics pageant in July; and
- Attend the next FNA Annual Potlatch to crown the new Miss FNA.
- Conduct herself in an appropriate manner, which includes remaining drug and alcohol free.
- Continue to be single, never married, not expecting a child, nor given birth to a child.

AFFIRMATION:

I solemnly swear that the information contained herein, and other documents submitted are true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that I may be disqualified if I deviate from any of the conditions set forth by the Fairbanks Native Association. I agree that if for any reason I am disqualified or elect not to participate, I will return the title, award, crown, and sash to FNA.
